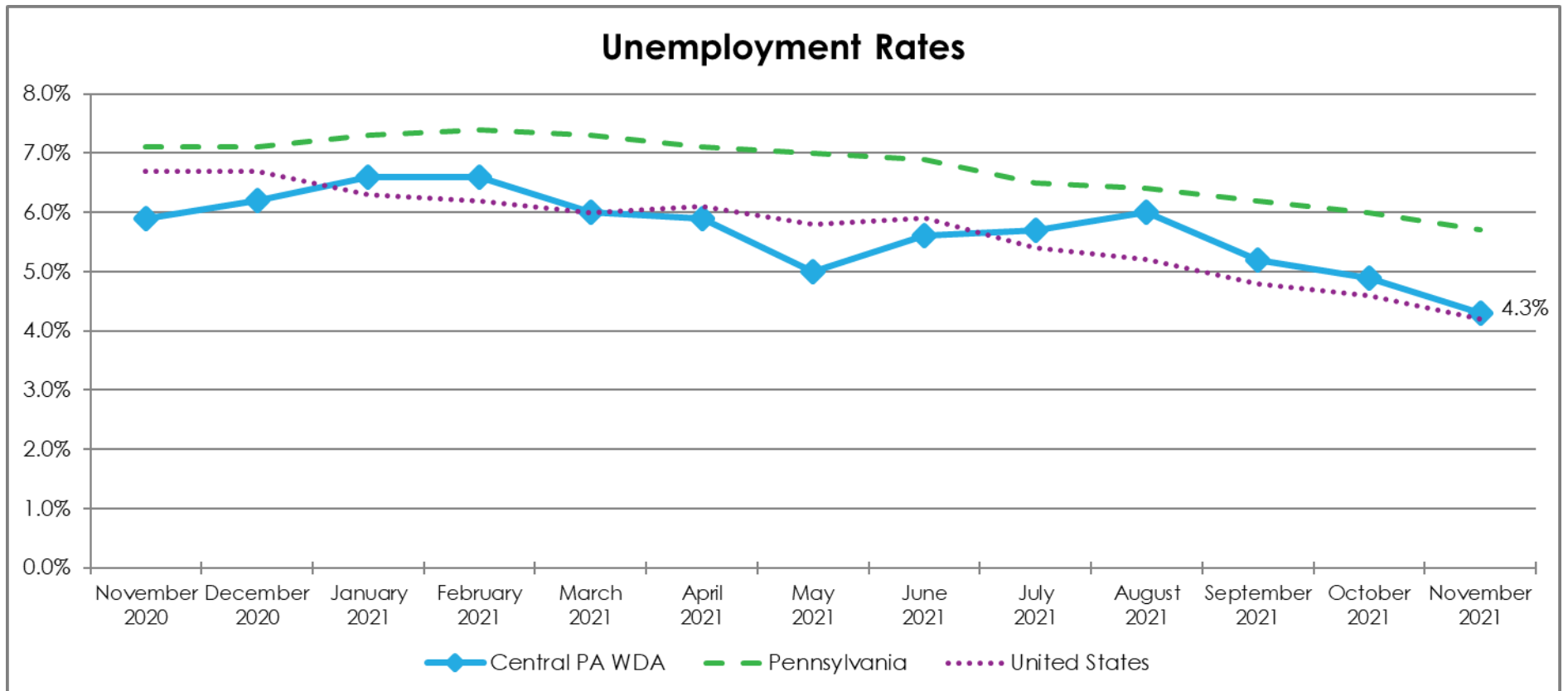

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## Civilian Labor Force

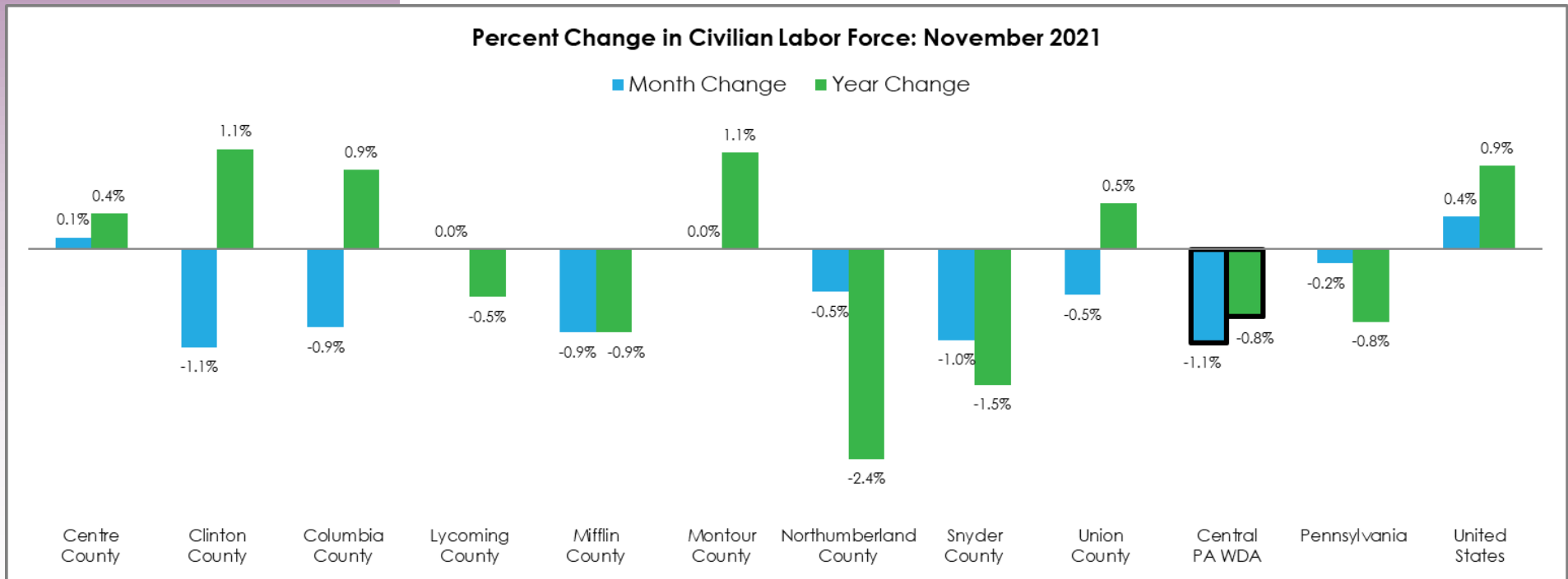

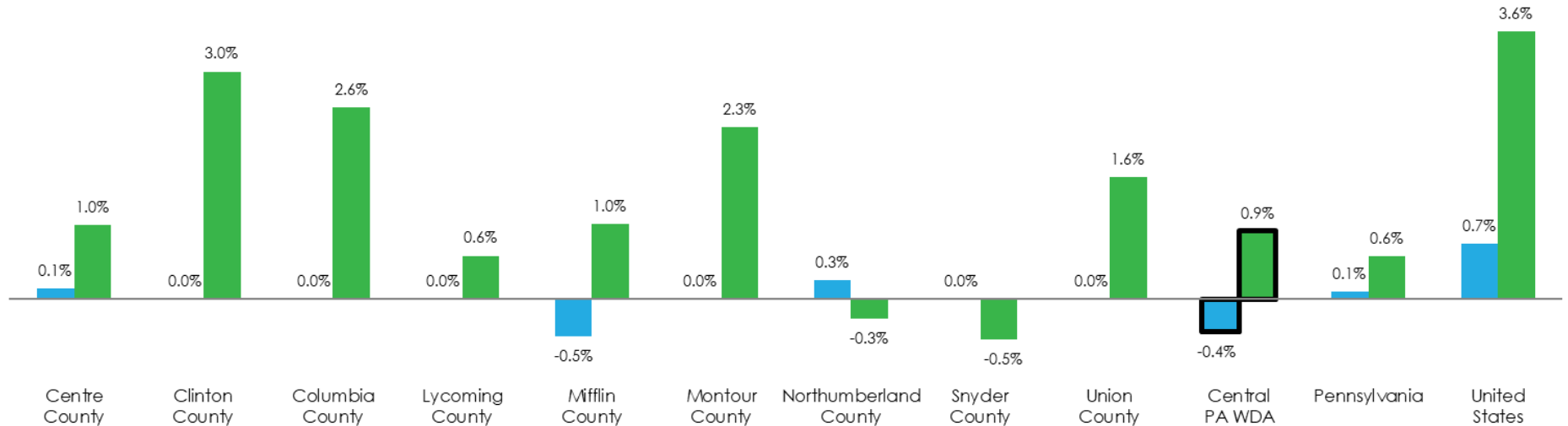

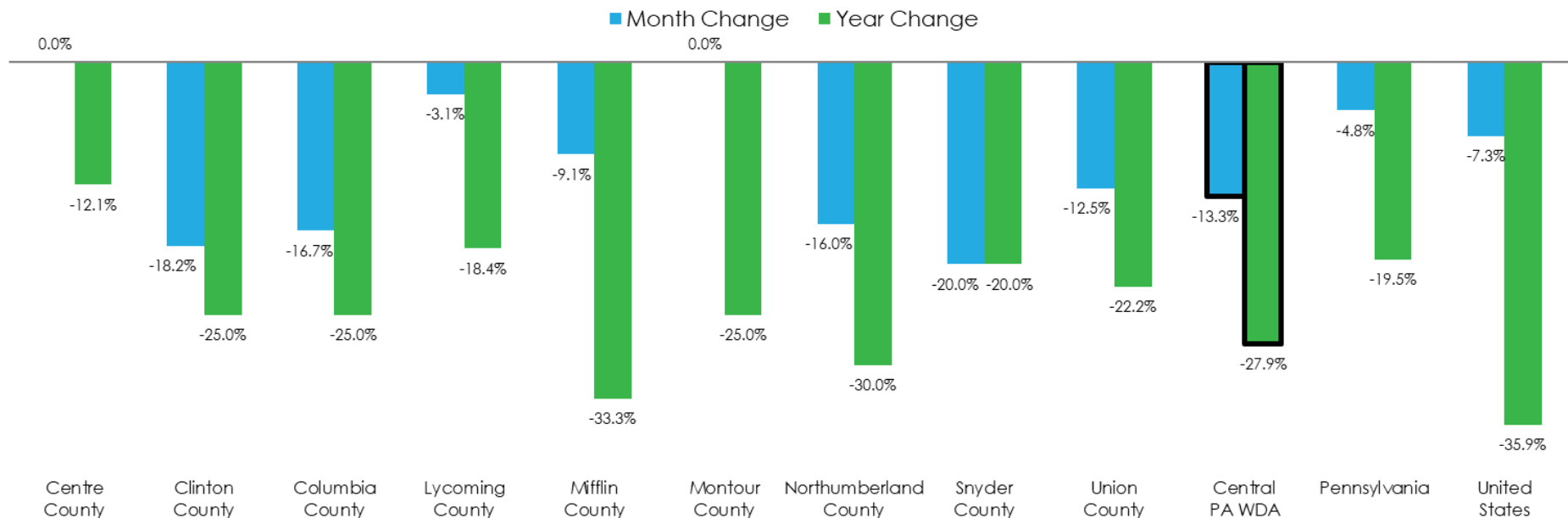

### Percent Change in Unemployed Population: November 2021



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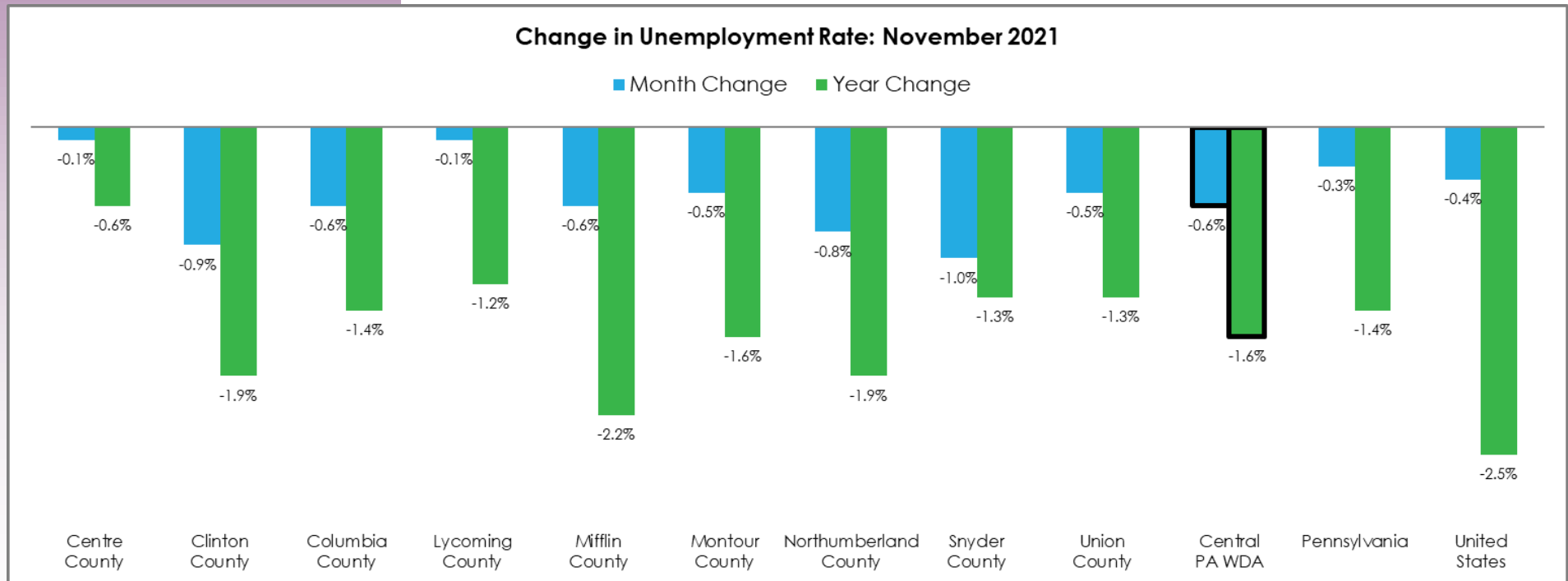
